

## THE RIFLES MEMORIALS POLICY

### General

The responsibility for the maintenance of memorials rests with the Trustees of Forming and Antecedent Regiments until such time as their funds are transferred to The Rifles. RHQ Winchester is the sole authority for the memorials database and any suggested additions/amendments are to be sent for consideration for inclusion to the Assistant Regimental Secretary Heritage (email: [aregsecprop@the-rifles.co.uk](mailto:aregsecprop@the-rifles.co.uk)).

Where the Policy is published:

- The Rifles Memorial Policy is published on The Rifles Collection website ([www.riflesmuseum.co.uk](http://www.riflesmuseum.co.uk)).
- The Roll of Honour is maintained by RHQ and displayed in each Rifles Battalion and other Rifles locations. It is also published on The Rifles website ([www.the-rifles.co.uk](http://www.the-rifles.co.uk))
- A Book of Remembrance listing all Rifleman who have died while serving is maintained in RHQ and also published on The Rifles website.

Prioritisation of entries. The majority of memorials are prioritised by entry in Annexes A, B and C into:

- Priority 1 – Memorials that must be maintained by the Regiment (Rifles, Forming and Antecedents).
- Priority 2 – Memorials whose maintenance the Regiment (Rifles, Forming and Antecedents) should contribute to.
- Priority 3 – Memorials whose maintenance the Regiment (Rifles, Forming and Antecedents) should contribute to if funds are available.

### Other Information/Comments.

1. Truro Cathedral represents all three services in the County.
2. Bodmin, as the County Town and also The Garrison Town of the DCLI represents the DCLI, SCLI, LI and The Rifles.
3. St Petroc's Church has a dedicated "Soldiers Chapel" which the DCLI Fund helps to maintain and has recently funded the relocation of Colours and plaques into the Chapel. The Fund has also granted £7,000 to completely renew the lighting in this area to better display these items. The Colours of 1 LI were framed and laid up in The Shire Hall, Bodmin.
4. The Cornwall Office has two "Cottage Homes" dedicated to the fallen in South Africa. These are managed by a Board of Trustees under strict Charity Commission rules. Funding is via maintenance contributions paid by the occupants and controlled by The Rifles Office (Bodmin).
5. Oxford Office intends to reopen the debate with Oxford City Council as Rose Hill is a large memorial on land given to the regiment at the end of the Great War. There is no paperwork in the County Office or the Oxf & Bucks Lt Infantry archives held by the Soldiers of Oxfordshire Trust which show that the on-going responsibility rests with the City/County Council, although this may have been agreed at the time the memorial was erected. There is also no paperwork concerning any of the other memorials or the chapel, although I think the Cathedral authorities could reasonably ask for a grant from regimental funds if the regimental chapel required a significant refurbishment.
6. The RGJ list omits mention of the TA regiments in London affiliated to the KRRC/RB in the First and Second World Wars. Responsibility for maintaining some of these memorials is unclear and should remain, in the first instance, with 4(V) RGJ Trustees. Any request for funding should be judged on its merits.
7. The RGJ antecedent regiments have always accepted some responsibility for the maintenance of the graves of their VC recipients, each case being judged on its merits. Once the antecedent regiments are unable to provide support, this responsibility should pass to the RGJ and then The Rifles. There could be reputational risk if we turned our back.
8. There are a substantial number of memorials in South Africa now being maintained by the CWGC under MOD contract because of the reputational risk arising from neglect. There are known to be other memorials in UK, including at Sandhurst and Eton, Europe, the West Indies and North America. It is also likely that there are others not recorded. Maintenance of these memorials is not given a priority. Any request for funding must be judged on its merits, taking into account reputational risk.
9. The KRRC/RB War Memorial Cottages are not included. They are already in the care of The Rifles.
10. The 2 x R.BERKS Colours given to St Mary's Church, Wallingford for safe keeping have been subject to a protracted discussion over their place and future. The Curate wanted rid of them as they are crumbling and 'handed' them to the Council who asked the Rifles Wardrobe Museum Trust for

advice. The result was that the Colours were to be returned to St Mary's: the curate now aware that Colours are given into the hand of a (regimental) church for safe keeping over their life time! However the Colours currently remain in the Town Council offices. The Chairman of Trustees and the Curator are in regular contact to resolve this.
